MOTION FOR APPOINTMENT OF PAUPER APPELLATE COUNSEL (Juvenile)

Counsel, on behalf of the mother and guardian of the juvenile, respectfully requests this court to:

(1) find the juvenile indigent for the purposes of perfecting an appeal in this cause, (2) to appoint pauper counsel to represent the defendant in perfecting a direct appeal of his [PICK ONE: true finding or violation of probation]. In support of the Motion, the juvenile states the following:

WHEREFORE, counsel, on behalf of the mother and guardian of the juvenile, respectfully requests this Court to: (1) find the juvenile indigent for the purposes of perfecting an appeal in this cause, (2) to, in a timely manner, appoint pauper counsel to represent the defendant in perfecting a direct appeal

of his [PICK ONE: true finding or violation of probation], and for all other relief just and proper in the premises.
